SC Rose Show Rules and Regulations

1. The South Carolina State Fair General Rules and Regulations shall apply in conjunction with the South Carolina State Fair Flower Show General Rules and Regulations.
2. Arrangement Design Reservations must be made in advance with William Patterson at 864-682-7673 or laurenroseman@aol.com by Sunday, Oct. 8, 2017.
3. Entries will be accepted from 7 am – 10 am, Friday, Oct. 13, 2017. **All exhibitors must sign in and provide their complete US mailing address.**
4. Everyone is eligible to enter roses in the rose show. The exhibitor must have grown all entries in his or her own private outdoor garden. Exhibitors may enter as many roses as desired, provided each is a different variety. Husbands and wives must enter as a team.
5. The Show Committee will furnish official entry tags and uniform containers. Both the top and bottom section of the entry tag must be completed. Classification as to variety and type will be in accordance with the current editions of **Modern Roses, The Official List of Approved Exhibition Names for Judges and Exhibitors, The Handbook for Selecting Roses, The American Rose Annual, and The Combined Rose List.** A rose with two or more names must be entered under its ARS approved name or code name. entries will be placed **alphabetically** by variety within each class. **Challenge Classes** are to be placed by the exhibitor. Judges will disqualify specimens for the following reasons: **misnamed, improperly named, misclassified, unlabeled, or mislabeled, stem on stem, (except on Species, OGR's and Shrubs, which may be shown stem on stem), foreign substance, not disbudded (in classes calling for one-bloom per stem entries), violation of ARS or local show rules, appearance of the exhibitor's name in other than the designated place on the entry tag.**
6. Wedging is permitted to stage a specimen in the container but should not be visible above the top of the vase.,
7. Ribbons for First, Second, Third, and Fourth Place may be awarded. Cash awards of \$1.00 for First Place and \$.50 for Second Place will be awarded. There are not cash awards for Third and Fourth Place. The South Carolina Rose Society will pay all awards.
8. Neither The South Carolina State Fair, The South Carolina Rose Society, its members or Show Committee shall be responsible for any personal injury, damage or loss of any property belonging to the exhibitor. All due precautions will be taken, but owners must assume risk.
9. Roses entered in the show become the property of the Show Committee.
10. The Show Chairman shall be the final authority in matters of dispute.

CAROLINA DISTRICT CHALLENGE CLASSES

Note: **Classes CD 1 - 3 are open only to ARS members residing in the Carolina District.**

Classes CD 4 - 9 are open to any exhibitor residing in the Carolina District.

All Carolina District Challenge Classes shall be judged by secret ballot, by all ARS Horticultural Judges judging in this show.

Only one entry is allowed per exhibitor or exhibiting team.

CLASS CD 1. J. HORACE MCFARLAND DISTRICT TROPHY. Five (5) one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea specimens, exhibition stage, each a different variety, correctly named and exhibited in separate containers with individual entry tags.

CLASS CD 2. THE RALPH S. MOORE DISTRICT TROPHY. Seven (7) one-bloom-per-stem Miniature specimens, exhibition stage, each a different variety, correctly named and exhibited in separate containers with individual entry tags.

CLASS CD 3. DR. GRIFFITH BUCK DISTRICT TROPHY. Three (3) Shrub roses, spray or individual bloom, different varieties, correctly named and exhibited in separate containers with individual entry tags.

CLASS CD 4. HOWARD WALTERS CHALLENGE AWARD. Three (3) one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora specimens, exhibition stage, each a different variety, each a different color, correctly named and exhibited in separate containers with individual entry tags.

CLASS CD 5. MILLIE WALTERS MINIATURE CHALLENGE AWARD. Five (5) one-bloom-per-stem Miniature specimens, same or different varieties, exhibition stage, correctly named, stage in a container furnished by the exhibitor. No wedging material permitted.

CLASS CD 6. TOM & ILSE ESTRIDGE FLORIBUNDA CHALLENGE AWARD. Three (3) one-bloom-per-stem Floribunda specimens, exhibition stage, each a different variety, correctly named and exhibited in separate containers with individual entry tags.

CLASS CD 7. "ROSES UNLIMITED" OLD GARDEN ROSE BOUQUET. A collection of seven (7) or more Old Garden Roses, same or different varieties, to be staged in a container furnished by the exhibitor and judged for overall beauty. All varieties must be listed on a single-entry tag.

CLASS CD 8. MARLYON WRIGHT DISTRICT MINIFLORA / MINIATURE CHALLENGE. A collection of seven (7) one-bloom-per-stem Miniature and/or Miniflora specimens, each a different variety, correctly named and exhibited in separate containers with individual entry tags.

CLASS CD 9. TOP GUN AARS CHALLENGE. An entry of three (3) one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Teas or Grandiflora specimens that have been designated as an All-America Rose Selection between 1941 through the current selections, correctly named and exhibited in separate containers with individual entry tags.

SOUTH CAROLINA ROSE SOCIETY CLASSES

ENGLISH BOXES

English Boxes will be issued on a first come, first served basis.

CLASS 1. Six (6) Hybrid Teas or Grandifloras, no more than two (2) blooms of a variety, exhibition stage, without foliage, one entry tag.

CLASS 2. Six (6) Miniatures or Minifloras, no more than two (2) blooms of a variety, exhibition stage, without foliage, one entry tag.

SOUTH CAROLINA ROSE SOCIETY CHALLENGE CLASSES

Note: Classes 3, 4 and 5 are open only to current members of The South Carolina Rose Society; only one entry is allowed per exhibitor or exhibiting team. Containers and American Boxes will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis.

CLASS 3. THE ARTHUR COTTINGHAM MEMORIAL CHALLENGE

A collection of three to twelve (3-12) individual exhibition hybrid tea or grandiflora specimens classified as light yellow, medium yellow, deep yellow or yellow blend, to be staged in a container furnished by the Show Committee; use one entry tag.

CLASS 4. MINIATURE AMERICAN BOX CHALLENGE

Nine (9) Miniature and or Miniflora exhibition roses, without foliage. Must have at least two varieties arranged in a geometric pattern. Boxes will be available from the Show Committee; use one entry tag.

CLASS 5. THE MICHAEL C. WILLIAMS CHALLENGE

A collection of six (6) one-bloom-per-stem Miniature and/or Miniflora specimens, exhibition stage, hybridized by Michael C. Williams, stage in a clear container furnished by the exhibitor. No more than two (2) specimens of a variety are allowed. Varieties and the number of specimens of each variety must be listed on one entry tag.

LARGE ROSES

CLASS 6. HYBRID TEAS AND GRANDIFLORAS

Individual one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora specimen, exhibition stage. Eligible for **QUEEN, KING, PRINCESS,** and **four (4) COURT OF HONOR** awards. ARS Certificates will be awarded.

CLASS 7. LIGHTLY PETALED HYBRID TEAS

Individual Single Type Hybrid Teas (4 - 12 petals), and those varieties classified by ARS as singles; may be one bloom or spray.

CLASS 8. HYBRID TEA OR GRANDIFLORA SPRAY

Individual Hybrid Tea spray or Grandiflora spray specimen. Lightly petaled hybrid teas (4 - 12 petals) are excluded from this class.

CLASS 9. FLORIBUNDAS

Individual one-bloom-per-stem Floribunda specimen, exhibition stage. **PRINCE OF SHOW** will be selected from this class.

CLASS 10. FLORIBUNDA SPRAY

Individual Floribunda spray specimen. Discreet disbudding permitted. **DUCHESS OF SHOW** will be selected from this class.

CLASS 11. FULLY OPEN ROSE

Individual one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora specimen, fully open with stamens showing. Lightly petaled hybrid teas (4 - 12 petals) are excluded from this class.

CLASS 12. POLYANTHA SPRAY

Individual polyantha spray specimen. Discreet disbudding permitted.

OLD GARDEN ROSES

CLASS 13. DOWAGER QUEEN

Individual specimen, may be one bloom or spray, naturally grown or discreetly disbudded. **Please list date of introduction** on top right-hand corner of entry tag. Variety must have been introduced prior to 1867.

CLASS 14. VICTORIAN ROSE

Individual specimen, may be one bloom or spray, naturally grown or discreetly disbudded. **Please list date of introduction** on top right-hand corner of entry tag. Variety must have been introduced in or after 1867, or have an unknown date of introduction.

LARGE ROSES MISCELLANEOUS CLASSES

CLASS 15. SPECIES ROSES

Individual specimen, may be one bloom or spray, naturally grown or discreetly disbudded.

CLASS 16. CLASSIC SHRUBS

Includes Hybrid Kordesii, Hybrid Moyes, Hybrid Rugosa and Hybrid Musk roses. Individual specimen, may be one bloom or spray, naturally grown or discreetly disbudded.

CLASS 17. MODERN SHRUBS

Includes all roses classified as Shrubs (S) by the ARS. Individual specimen, may be one bloom or spray, naturally grown or discreetly disbudded.

CLASS 18. CLIMBERS

Includes Large-Flowered Climbers, Hybrid Gigantea and Hybrid Wichurana. Individual specimen, may be one bloom or spray, naturally grown or discreetly disbudded.

CLASS 19. CYCLE OF BLOOM

Three (3) one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora specimens, same variety, one container; one specimen one fourth open (bud), one specimen one half to three fourths open (exhibition stage), and one specimen fully open with stamens showing.

CLASS 20. HI-LO MATCHING PAIR

One (1) individual one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora specimen, and one (1) individual one-bloom-per-stem matching Miniature or Miniflora specimen, exhibition stage, correctly named, separate containers with individual entry tags. Specimens should match in form and color; place Miniature or Miniflora specimen in front.

CLASS 21. THREE SAME VARIETY

Three (3) one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora specimens, exhibition stage, same variety, one container, one entry tag.

CLASS 22. THREE DIFFERENT VARIETIES

Three (3) one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea and or Grandiflora specimens, exhibition stage, different varieties, one container, one entry tag.

CLASS 23. FIVE SAME VARIETY

Five (5) one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora specimens, exhibition stage, same variety, one container, one entry tag.

CLASS 24. FIVE DIFFERENT VARIETIES

Five (5) one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea and or Grandiflora specimens, different varieties, one container, one entry tag.

MINIATURE ROSES (EXCLUDES MINIFLORAS)

CLASS 25. MINIATURES

Individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniature specimen, exhibition stage. Eligible for **MINI QUEEN, KING, PRINCESS**, and four (4) **COURT OF HONOR** awards. ARS Certificates will be awarded.

CLASS 26. MINIATURE SPRAYS

Individual Miniature spray specimen. **MINIATURE PRINCE** will be selected from this class. Lightly petaled (4-12 petals) Miniatures are excluded from this class.

CLASS 27. LIGHTLY PETALED MINIATURES

Individual one-bloom-per-stem Single Type Miniature (4 - 12 petals) specimen, and those varieties classified by ARS as singles; may be one bloom or spray.

MINIFLORA ROSES (EXCLUDES MINIATURES)

CLASS 28. MINIFLORAS

Individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniflora specimen, exhibition stage. Eligible for **MINIFLORA QUEEN, KING, PRINCESS**, and four (4) **COURT OF HONOR** awards. ARS Certificates will be awarded.

CLASS 29. MINIFLORA SPRAYS

Individual Miniflora spray specimen. **MINIFLORA PRINCE** will be selected from this class. Lightly petaled (4-12 petals) Minifloras are excluded from this class.

CLASS 30. LIGHTLY PETALED MINIFLORAS

Individual one bloom per stem Single Type Miniflora (4-12 petals) specimen, and those varieties classed by ARS as singles: may be one bloom or spray.

MINIATURE AND MINIFLORA ROSE MISCELLANEOUS CLASSES

CLASS 31. FULLY OPEN

Individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniature or Miniflora fully open specimen with stamens showing. Lightly petaled miniatures (4 - 12 petals) are excluded from this class. **MINIATURE DUCHESS** will be chosen from this class.

CLASS 32. CYCLE OF BLOOM

Three (3) individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniature or Miniflora specimens, same variety, one container; one specimen one fourth open (bud), one specimen one half to three fourths open (exhibition stage), and one specimen fully open (stamens showing).

CLASS 33. FLOATING ROSE

One exhibition Miniature or Miniflora specimen floating in a plastic container furnished by the show committee. Limit two entries per exhibitor or exhibiting team. No foliage permitted.

CLASS 34. THREE SAME VARIETY

Three (3) individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniature or Miniflora specimens, exhibition stage, same variety, one container, one entry tag.

CLASS 35. THREE DIFFERENT VARIETIES

Three (3) individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniature and or Miniflora specimens, exhibition stage, different varieties, one container, one entry tag.

CLASS 36. FIVE SAME VARIETY

Five (5) individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniature or Miniflora specimens, exhibition stage, same variety, one container, one entry tag.

CLASS 37. FIVE DIFFERENT VARIETIES

Five (5) individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniature and or Miniflora specimens, exhibition stage, different varieties, one container, one entry tag.

NOVICE CLASSES

*Entries are limited to exhibitors who have never won a **TOP AWARD** in an ARS sponsored show.*

CLASS 38. NOVICE HYBRID TEA Or GRANDIFLORA

Individual one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora specimen, exhibition stage. Eligible for **NOVICE QUEEN**.

CLASS 39. NOVICE MINIATURE Or MINIFLORA

Individual one-bloom-per-stem Miniature or Miniflora specimen, exhibition stage. Eligible for **NOVICE KING**.

CLASS 40. NOVICE CLIMBER, OLD GARDEN ROSE, Or SHRUB

Individual exhibition specimen or spray. Eligible for **NOVICE PRINCESS**.

JUDGES CLASSES

Entries are limited to ARS horticulture and arrangements judges judging in this show.

NOTE: Judges judging arrangements are encouraged to enter all open horticulture classes; judges judging horticulture are encouraged to enter all open arrangements classes.

CLASS 41. JUDGES HYBRID TEA Or GRANDIFLORA

Individual or collection of one-bloom-per-stem Hybrid Tea and or Grandiflora specimen(s), exhibition stage, one container furnished by the exhibitor, one entry tag. Eligible for ARS JUDGES CERTIFICATE.

CLASS 42. JUDGES MINIATURE Or MINIFLORA

Individual or collection of one-bloom-per-stem Miniflora and or Miniature specimen(s), exhibition stage, one container furnished by the exhibitor, one entry tag. Eligible for ARS JUDGES CERTIFICATE.

CLASS 43. JUDGES SHRUBS, CLIMBERS Or OLD GARDEN ROSES

Individual or collection of shrub and or climber and or old garden rose specimen(s), one container furnished by the exhibitor, one entry tag. Eligible for ARS JUDGES CERTIFICATE.
